Today's Hymn, "Savior of the Nations Come," has historically been sung on the first Sunday of Advent since it was penned by Martin Luther in 1524. The text was inspired by the hymn text "Come, Redeemer," thought to have been written by Ambrose of Milan in the late fourth century. Luther's tune has been used throughout western music history, most notably by Bach who not only used the tune for his great chorale prelude (as played by Cal this morning), but in his cantata of 1724.

LIGHTING THE CANDLE OF HOPE

Leader: We light the Advent candles, praying that our preparation for Christmas may help us to look

outward in love, and look forward in hope.

All: Restore us, O God of hosts; let Your face shine, that we may be saved.

Leader: There are five candles.

We light a new candle each Sunday from now until Christmas. Candles are useful. They give

light and warmth when electricity fails.

Candles are simple, yet ingenious. They show us the inventiveness of people in the past and

connect us with generations before us.

Candles are special. In the dark, they give bright light and warm shadows. Candlelight brings us together as we talk and laugh and listen.

All: Restore us, O God of hosts; let Your face shine, that we may be saved.

Leader: In Isaiah, chapter 64, a prophet cries out to God: "O that You would tear open the heavens, and come down. O that You would make Your name known. You have hidden Your face from us. Yet we are the clay, and You are our potter; we are all the work of Your hand." Today we light the first candle, the Candle of Hope, as a prayer for our suffering world, that God, Who is often hidden, may be revealed to us and to all. Living God, come to our world.

All: Restore us, O God of hosts; let Your face shine, that we may be saved.
